



FSU IGC SURVEY WAVE 1 TOPLINE

The study was conducted on behalf of Florida State University's Institute for Governance and Civics using the SSRS Probability-Based Opinion Panel. Interviews were collected via web from May 21 to June 3, 2025 among a total of 1,004 respondents age 18 or older. The margin of error for total respondents is +/-3.4% at the 95% confidence level. All percentages displayed in this topline are weighted. All N sizes are unweighted. Question text noted in parentheses was rotated or randomized.
